ABOUT BOB MARLEY

- 1. Bob Marley was a musician from Jamaica. He helped make **reggae** music famous and was a member of the **Rastafarian** movement.
- 2. In the 1960s, Bob Marley began making music in a **community** called Trench Town. This was an **artistic** community in Kingston. Trench Town was **poor**, but full of **culture**. It became the Hollywood of Jamaica.
- 3. Bob Marley and his friend Bunny took vocal lessons. They formed a band called the Wailing Wailers. The Wailers added jazz and blues sounds to Jamaican ska music and wrote **spiritual** lyrics about their homeland (Africa).
- 4. In 1972, a major record label called Island Records **signed** the Wailers. People around the world fell in love with reggae music, and Bob Marley and his band became famous.
- 5. The **Third World's** first pop star died of cancer in 1981 at the age of 36. His reggae **hits** like *One Love* and *Get Up, Stand Up* live on.
