## FIRST CONDITIONAL

# **A. Introduction to Conditionals**

Conditionals are used to express a *hypothetical* situation. This is when you don't know if something will happen or not, so you make a guess about what the result might be. There are four conditional patterns in the English language, and they usually involve an "if" clause. This lesson will focus on the **first conditional**, also known as the **real conditional**.

# **B.** The First Conditional

**Pattern:** If + present, will + base verb

**Use:** The first conditional shows a **likely** or **possible** outcome that will probably happen

if a certain condition is met.

# **Tip #1**

The verb in the *if clause* is a **simple present** verb, and the verb in the *main clause* is **will +** the **base form** of the verb. A sentence can begin with either clause with no change in meaning. Remember that a sentence that begins with an *if clause* is followed by a comma.

- If it's sunny tomorrow, they will go to the beach.
- They will go to the beach if it's sunny tomorrow.

	Examples			
Sentences	Condition Outcome		Explanation	
<ul> <li>If I study for the test, I will get a good grade.</li> <li>I will get a good grade if I study for the test.</li> </ul>	studying	good grade	Studying makes it likely that I will get a good grade on the test.	
<ul> <li>If Mr. Smith has a second cup of coffee, he will probably be late for work.</li> <li>Mr. Smith will probably be late for work if he has a second cup of coffee.</li> </ul>	second cup of coffee	late for work	Having another cup of coffee makes it possible that Mr. Smith will be late.

# **B.** The First Conditional cont.

# **Tip #2**

It is possible to have a **negative** verb in the *if clause*, the main clause, or both. The contraction of *will not* is *won't*.

- If I don't pass this test, my parents will be very angry.
- If I forget to water the plants, they **won't survive**.
- If I'm not late for work again, I won't have to look for another job.

# Tip #3

The verb in the *if clause* will end in **-s** if the subject is third person singular.

- If she watches that sad movie, she will cry.
- She will cry if she **watches** that sad movie.

# Tip #4

Though not as common, it is possible to use **be going to** + **base verb** or the **present progressive** (which are the two other ways of forming the simple future in English) in place of will + base verb with no change in meaning.

For example, these sentences all have the same meaning:

- If it doesn't rain, we will go for a walk. (will + V)
- If it doesn't rain, we are going to go for a walk. (be going to + V)
- If it doesn't rain, we are going for a walk. (be + -ing V)
