#### **Dialogue 1**

This cake is **sweet**.




This lemonade is **sour**.

# Let's Learn! cont.

#### B. Likes & Dislikes ◆

Use like + noun/pronoun or don't like + noun/pronoun.

- I like lemonade. / I like it.
- I don't like cake. / I don't like it.
- I don't like tacos. / I don't like them.

#### C. Questions & Answers 49

Use **do you like + noun/pronoun** to ask if someone likes foods or tastes.

Questions:		Answers:	
•	Do you like cake?	•	Yes, I do.
•	Do you like it?	•	No, I don't.
•	Do you like sweet food?	•	Not really.
		•	It's delicious.
		•	It's okay.

## D. Too + Adjective ◀》

Use **too + adjective** to show why you *don't* like a taste.

- This lemonade is too sour.
- That cake is **too sweet**.
- Those tacos are too spicy.
- It is too mild.
- They are too salty.

### **Spelling Tip:**

Remember that the adverb "too" with two o's means *overly*.
