## A. Adjectives (a)

This lemonade is sour.


These chips are salty.


## Let's Learn! cont.

## B. Likes \& Dislikes (i)

Use like + noun/pronoun or don't like + noun/pronoun.

- I like lemonade. / I like it.
- I don't like cake. / I don't like it.
- I don't like tacos. / I don't like them.


## C. Questions \& Answers (1))

Use do you like + noun/pronoun to ask if someone likes foods or tastes.

## Questions:

- Do you like cake?
- Do you like it?
- Do you like sweet food?


## Answers:

- Yes, I do.
- No, I don't.
- Not really.
- It's delicious.
- It's okay.
D. Too + Adjective ( $\mathrm{A}^{()}$

Use too + adjective to show why you don't like a taste.

- This lemonade is too sour.
- That cake is too sweet.


## Spelling Tip:

Remember that the adverb "too" with two o's means overly.

- Those tacos are too spicy.
- It is too mild.
- They are too salty.
