to supply reasons for their opinion.

In alignment with common core standards, pages 3-4 are designed for
upper grades, as it also requires students to supply examples/details
for those reasons.

#### To use as a digital resource:

This resource is originally designed to be used as a google classroom
 assignment. In order to have it google classroom ready:

- 1. Select the slides you would like to be used in the assignment (hold ctrl to select multiple slides)
- 2. Go to file > make a copy > selected slides
- 3. Name it and assign it through google classroom. Students will only be able to type where it says "type here".
