

# Comparative Adjectives

## Use

Use comparative adjectives to compare two people, places, or things.

## Form

### A. Chart

Number of Syllables	Form	Example
<b>one</b>	Adj + <i>-er</i>	tall + <i>-er</i> = taller
<b>two</b> (ending in <i>-y</i> )	<i>-y</i> changes to <i>-i</i> + <i>-er</i>	happy + <i>-er</i> = happier
<b>two</b> (not ending in <i>-y</i> )	<i>more</i> + Adj	<i>more</i> + famous = more famous
<b>three or more</b>	<i>more</i> + Adj	<i>more</i> + beautiful = more beautiful

### B. Examples

1. Maria is **taller than** Jack.
2. I feel **happier** today **than** I did yesterday.
3. The lead actor on that show is **more famous than** the lead actress.
4. Sunsets at the beach are **more beautiful than** sunsets in the city.
