Quick and Handy Grammar Review

Prepositions have many uses in English. For example, they can express time (*in 2012, at 7:00, during the meeting*), place (*on the chair, at a restaurant, behind the sofa*), direction (*to the store, from Japan*), method (*by mail, with a fork*), material (*of wood, with cotton*), etc. Let's take a look at some common prepositions in English, and then we'll practise using them.

A. Common Prepositions

The following is a list of common prepositions, some notes on their use, and examples.

Preposition	Meaning(s)	Examples
about	on (the subject of), around (a place)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I read a book about the war. The speech was about causes of cancer. You can now move freely about the cabin.
above	on top of	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I placed the painting above the table. The blue sky was above us all afternoon.
across (from)	on the other side	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The theatre is across from the bank. Columbus travelled across the ocean in 1492.
after	later in time	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> After the game, the players went to dinner. After lunch, I studied in the library. The students were very tired after the exam.
against	opposed to, in contact with	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mr. Jones ran against Ms. Adams for treasurer. The umbrella is leaning against the wall.
along	on the side of	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We strolled along the bank of the river. There are many hotels along the Danube.
among	in the midst of	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There is a cat sitting among the flowers. He was found among the dead after the battle.
around	in a circle, turning a corner	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The teacher walked around the room. Ken lives around the block.

B. Prepositional Phrases

One of the most common constructions in the English language is the prepositional phrase. Sometimes there are even two or three prepositional phrases used in the same sentence. (E.g., *In 2015, she travelled to Chile.*)

A basic prepositional phrase has three words: *preposition, article, noun*. This is the most common construction. Other words, such as adjectives, may be added. The article is not used in some phrases, and the noun may be replaced by a pronoun. Analyze the following examples:

preposition + article + noun

- in the closet
- over the chair
- to the bank
- from an admirer

preposition + noun

- to India
- near New York
- after lunch

preposition + pronoun

- toward me
- with them
